Cynthia left this world at 1:30 a.m. on the feast day of Our Lady of Fatima. Obviously, Our Lady wanted Cynthia to come early for the heavenly festivities.

Cynthia was a loving and committed mother to her only child, Stephanie Elise Martens. They communicated on a daily basis sharing their thoughts, hopes, joys, and sorrows. They were both overjoyed to share Mother's Day together on the 8th of May.

Cynthia was married to Mark Salvato for 25 beautiful years. Cynthia and Mark were constant companions and they deeply loved each other. Cynthia's father warned that working together would ruin their marriage because, "being together all day long is not good for a husband and wife." Her father was usually right when he made a prediction, but he was wrong on that one.
